# **Additional Information for Yudansha Promotions**

The contents of the examinations are determined by Igarashi Dojo, whereas the classes needed are specific to Calgary Aikikai. Attendance requirements are seen as minimum amounts; more may be suitable. One class is equivalent to one day's practice of any length, one hour attended at a seminar, or attendance at a dojo banquet.

### An eligible candidate for any Yudansha test:

- has submitted a Calgary Aikikai test application three months prior to the test if being tested by Calgary Aikikai
- is over 16 years of age
- is up-to-date on mat and membership fees
- has been training regularly at Calgary Aikikai or affiliated dojo for at least one year at the time of application (three months prior to test)
- has practiced the required number of classes since their previous test
- has been training for the required number of years since their previous test
- has attended the required seminars per year since their previous test (Present Yudansha card to the Calgary Aikikai Technical Committee)
- has had a pre-test conducted by the Calgary Aikikai Technical Committee two months prior to the test (with their own sensei present, if applicable) and received approval to proceed with the test
- has submitted a Hombu Dojo test application to the Calgary Aikikai Technical Committee two days prior to test
- has paid the test fee to the Calgary Aikikai Technical Committee two days prior to test (see below)
- has submitted the required essay to the Calgary Aikikai Technical Committee two days prior to test

### Fees (for a test conducted by Igarashi Sensei):

Shodan: ¥22 000 (¥2 000 test + ¥12 000 certificate + ¥8 000 yudansha book)

Nidan: ¥22 000 (¥2 000 test + ¥20 000 certificate)
Sandan: ¥32 000 (¥2 000 test + ¥30 000 certificate)
Yondan: ¥53 800 (¥2 000 test + ¥51 800 certificate)

(Note: ¥2 000 test fee is due two days before the test along with Hombu test application. The remainder is due after the candidate has passed. Fees are cash only, in Japanese yen. These fees are subject to change. (\$1 CAD = ~¥110 JPY at time of writing) Tests conducted by Calgary Aikikai test committee omit the ¥2 000 test fee, but add the usual \$35 test fee, payable via the website.

For Shodan recipients, the hakama is for them to purchase, and the black belt is a gift from Calgary Aikikai.

## **Support Payments**

Yudansha grade recipients will be automatically billed an additional support payment from Hombu, equivalent to ¥1 000 for each level of rank (e.g. Sandan candidate will be charged ¥3 000). If the student has already made approximately one support payment per year, then these will be subtracted from the support payments billed at the time of the promotion. Additional support payments can be added and are encouraged.
